Anna Budde, MD, Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology, University of Minnesota

Dr. Budde is an anesthesiologist and intensivist at the University of Minnesota Medical

Center. She completed her fellowship training in critical care anesthesiology at the University of Chicago, her residency training in anesthesiology at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center / Harvard Medical School and medical school at Georgetown University School of Medicine.



Arnoley Abcejo, MD, Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology, Mayo Clinic

Dr. Abcejo is a practicing neuroanesthesiologist and Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology at Mayo

Clinic Rochester. He completed his undergraduate training at the University of Pennsylvania and graduated from medical school at the University of Minnesota. He completed his fellowship in NeuroAnesthesiolgy in 2017 and is an active researcher, resident educator and patient safety advocate. He has research interests in the vulnerable brain particularly concussion and anesthesia, venous air embolism physiology, patient safety and anesthesia education. He published the seminal article describing the epidemiology of anesthesia after concussion or mild traumatic brain injury in the Mayo Clinic Proceedings. He has been recognized with several awards in anesthesia education. He is an active member of the Anesthesia Patient Safety Foundation, and serves as Website Medical Director and member of the Communications Committee.



Francis Salinas, MD, Staff Anesthesiologist, Swedish Medical Center, Seattle and Issaquah, WA, Medical Director, Interventional and Perioperative Services, Swedish Hospital, Issaquah, WA, US-Anesthesia Partners-WA

Dr. Salinas is currently in private

practice with US-Anesthesia Partners, WA. He works at three different hospitals and a large free-standing ambulatory center associated with Swedish Medical Center in the Seattle metropolitan area. His areas of interest include regional anesthesia, acute perioperative pain management, and ambulatory anesthesia. He also serves as the medical director of the interventional platform (OR, GI endoscopy, IR, and labor and delivery) at Swedish Hospital-Issaquah. Prior to entering private practice in 2016, he was on the teaching faculty at Virginia Mason Medical Center in Seattle from 2001-2015, where his focus of interests were regional anesthesia and cardiothoracic anesthesia/perioperative TEE.



Hugh Smith, MD, PhD, Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology, Mayo Clinic

Dr. Smith is originally from Manitoba, Canada. He completed an undergraduate degree in Economics at Queens University, Kingston, Ontario. He then obtained a

Master's degree in Philosophy, and a Doctorate in Medical History prior to commencing medical training at the University of Minnesota Medical School. After completing anesthesia residency at Mayo Clinic, Dr. Smith joined the staff and completed a fellowship year in Regional Anesthesia. He has been on staff with the Department of Anesthesiology and Perioperative Medicine since 2005.

Dr. Smith is the project chair of an institutionally sponsored effort to implement a Perioperative Surgical Home in Orthopedic Surgery, and a representative of Mayo Clinic with the American Society of Anesthesiology's Perioperative Surgical Home Collaborative 2020.

At the MSA meeting, Dr. Smith will be discussing the evolution of value-based reimbursement, the expanding role of anesthesiologists in the perioperative space, and the success of a perioperative surgical home model in orthopedic surgical care pathways.
